

Mechthild Karkow is an international prizewinner, performing around the world as a soloist, concertmaster and chamber musician in various ensembles, and playing in renowned festivals. Since 2013 she has been professor of baroque violin at the University of Music and Theatre 'Felix Mendelssohn Bartholdy' in Leipzig, and from 2015-2020 she also taught at Frankfurt University of Music and Performing Arts.
